Summarize the analysis of data regarding curriculum and instruction:

Strengths:

Up-to-date curriculum throughout building with both vertical and horizontal alignment. The district has employed instructional coaches to identify instructional problematic areas and correction procedures. Missouri Reading Initiative was expanded K through 4 for the 2021-2022 school year. This will be continued for 2022-2023. High dosage tutoring has also been implemented and the addition of transportation for the students who require these services has been added.

Weaknesses:

The district would like to provide greater instructional development for the delivery of instruction via technology in the classroom setting. Students need devices to more readily assess learning and to implement small group or whole group efforts in reading and math. No reading specialist at the Kindergarten level at West Plains Elementary as discussed in the 2022 Spring Title I meeting.

Indicate needs related to strengths and weaknesses:

The district will contract with the MRI to attend to improved reading and writing instructional progress for educators.

The district will make the effort to provide devices to students to improve assessment for learning efforts and to increase opportunities for diversified instruction. The district, based upon parental and community agency input, has chosen to expand a reading specialist for the 2021-2022 school year for Kindergarten. The data of this addition was shared with the group for the 22-23 school year and the growth the students have seen due to the addition of the specialists at this grade level.


