Hearts in Joplin



While many people continued with their summer, the FCCLA of the South Central Career Center, traveled to Joplin with loads



of love and needed supplies. The photo to the above left, was a heart shaped cookie cutter found by Mrs. Ruby Collins, one of our FACS instructors. She stated that it was shocking to find something that connected her and her profession with such a tragic event. Mrs. Collins saw the cookie cutter in a pile of rubble located in the basement of a home next to Mr. William Brewer's home. Mr. Brewer was a victim of the Joplin tornado. He was pushed into a closet of his home by the strong winds of the storm. When Mr. Brewer tried to leave his closet, after the storm had passed, he found that a piece of rebar from the home's foundation had gone through his leg. He was there for several hours before his neighbors found him. As rescue crews worked in his neighborhood they would use a variety of flags to label the most critical survivors to the least critical. It took one and a half days for Mr. Brewer to receive treatment for his injury. Mr. Brewer is pictured above with FCCLA members (left to right) Caleb Hearon, Josey Stevens, Derek Price, Cecilia Lundry, Mr. Brewer, Mickayla Irwin, and Mikayla Lambe. The photo was taken by Mrs. Collins in front of Mr. Brewer's new truck and travel trailer. He plans to travel across the country and visit family. The FCCLA visit lasted from June 29 to July 1 when they also delivered supplies to area Catholic Schools and assisted with the 9th and 10th grade classrooms at the Joplin School.
